

Kangaroos



• They are the largest living marsupials from the family Macropodidae. There are 4 species of kangaroos: red kangaroo, eastern grey kangaroo, western grey kangaroo and antilopine kangaroo.

 They are the only large animals to use hopping as a means of locomotion.

• They are found in Australia and Tasmania, as well as on surrounding islands. They live in varied habitats, from forests and woodland areas to grassy plains and savannas.

 Male kangaroos are called boomers, bucks or jacks; females are does, flyers, or jills, and the young ones are joeys. Several kangaroos are called a mob, troop or court.

• Kangaroos are grazing herbivores, which means their diet consists mainly of grasses. They can survive long periods without water.

• Because of its long feet, a kangaroo cannot walk normally. To

move at slow speeds, a kangaroo will use its tail to form a tripod with its two forelimbs. It then raises its hind feet forward, in a form of locomotion called "crawl-walking."

• Female kangaroos give birth to one joey at a time. Newborns weigh as little as 0.03 ounces at birth - as small as a lima bean! After birth, the joey crawls into its mother's pouch, where it will nurse and continue to grow and develop up to when they are 1 year old.



Magnets

- Magnetic fields by themselves are invisible to the human eye.
- Today's high speed trains use magnets to float each car, reducing friction and allowing the train to run very efficiently.




 Magnets are objects that produce an area of magnetic force called a magnetic field.

- Magnets can be found in common household items as phones, computers, stereos, TVs.
- Electromagnets are created by an electric current running through a surrounding coil. They have many uses including the generation of electricity in hydroelectric dams.
- Magnets have a magnetic north pole and a magnetic south pole. If the same pole of two magnets are placed near each other they will push away (repel), while if different poles are placed near each other they will pull together (attract).
- Magnets are made from materials that contain nickel, iron, or cobalt. When these materials are exposed to a magnetic field, the structure of the material is actually changed on a microscopic level. The molecules are polarized, or rearranged into lines. When enough of the metal is polarized, it becomes a magnet.
